- We **blew up** many balloons for the party.

- \* Extinguish, stop burning
- \* Deflate

- \* Escape
- \* Leave, become separated

- \* Start
- \* Escape

\* *Patlamak*

- The breeze made all the candles on the table **blow out**.
- The road was so bad that one of my front tyres **blew out**.

**Break away** \* *Kaçmak*  
\* *Ayrılmak, kopmak*

- The thieves managed to **break away** after they stole the money.
- A tourist **broke away** from the tour group.

**Break out** \* *Başlamak*  
\* *Kaçmak*

6

- A fire **broke out** in the building.
- A few prisoners were reported to have **broken out** of a top-security jail.

- \* Intrude
- \* Interrupt

## Break up

- \* End
- \* End relationship
- \* Separate, disintegrate

**Break through** \* *Yarıp geçmek*

\* *Ortaya çıkmak, belirmek*

- Some protestors **broke through** the police lines easily.
- We can see the sunshine **breaking through** the clouds.

**Break in** \* *Bir yere zorla girmek*

\* *Sözünü kesmek, lafa karışma*

- A man **broke in** through one of the front doors.
- When the kid **broke in**, saying “that’s a lie”, his father got very angry.

**Break up** \* *Sona ermek*

\* *İlişkiyi sonlandırmak, ayrılmak*

\* *Parçalara ayrılmak, parçalamak*

9

- The garden party **broke up** at ten o'clock.
- Jenny and Bill have **broken up** recently.
- The chicken was **broken up** into pieces by the children.
