



Until the 1930s, most passenger aircraft were biplanes, with two pairs of wings and a wooden or metal framework covered with fabric or sometimes plywood. Such aircraft were restricted to low speeds and low altitudes because of the drag on their wings. Many had an open cockpit, situated behind or in front of an enclosed-but unpressurized -cabin that carried a maximum of ten people. The passengers usually sat in wicker chairs that weren't bolted to the floor, and the journey could be bumpy when flying through turbulence. Warm clothing, and ear plugs to reduce the effects of prolonged noise, were required. During the 1930s, powerful, streamlined, all metal monoplanes became widespread. By 1939, the advent of pressurized cabins allowed fast flights at high altitudes, where there is less turbulence. Flying boats were still necessary on many routes until 1945 because of inadequate runways and the frequency of emergency sea landings. The Second World War, however, resulted in enough good runways being built for land-planes to become standard on all major airline routes.
