Paul Allen and Bill Gates, Microsoft's co-founders, met at Lakeside School, a private middle and high school, in Seattle, Washington. Though Gates was two years Allen's junior, the two bonded over their passion for computers. Upon graduating, Allen went to Washington State University to pursue a degree in computer science, but dropped out after two years and joined Honeywell in Boston, MA as a programmer. In early 1975, Allen saw the Altair 8800 featured on the cover of Popular Electronics magazine. Unlike other computers, which were built for corporations, this model was designed to appeal to individual consumers. Realizing the potential of software, he managed to convince Gates, then a sophomore at Harvard University, to drop out and join him to start what he called Micro-Soft. After creating software to improve the performance of the Altair 8800, the pair went on to design software for the Apple II and Radio Shack's TRS-80. The experience eventually led to the development of the Microsoft MS-DOS operating system, which currently boasts nearly 500 million users worldwide.
