

  - In the *absence* of her mother, the baby cries non-stop till she falls asleep.
- 9. absent-minded unutkan = forgetful

     forget the way to your house.
- 10. absolutely tamamen
  - Priyanka Chopra's red Dior dress for Indian wedding reception is absolutely stunning.


